Young people's success stories

Ofeina Langi recently graduated from her Asia Pacific Leadership Fellowship in Hawaii. The programme has a network of 461 leaders from 53 Asia Pacific countries. She attended the Leadership Programme through her work, as Manukau Community Advisor at the Department of Internal Affairs (DIA).

Ofeina progressed her career path following the things she feels passionate about. She has moved from being a young person involved in MYD's youth participation training, to currently working with the DIA and doing great things in between.

Ofeina was the coordinator and member of the Otara Youth Collective, which MYD worked with in 2009 by providing training and mentoring to its members.

Since attending the Fellowship Programme, Ofeina has been appointed as a member of the Auckland Council's Pacific Advisory Panel, where she contributes to dealing with important issues involving the city and its people.

Melissa Lelo, MYD Regional Youth Participation Advisor says "Ofeina is a motivated young woman with the great vision and insight into making a difference for young people and communities. Not long after meeting she said "I want your job!" I believe she has the ambition to do whatever she sets her mind on achieving. I'm proud to have been part of her journey."

Ofeina plans to continue learning and having discussions about key themes she is passionate about - social enterprise, leadership and creating a community of action.

Survey of student services

The Ministry of Education wants to know what you think about putting a whole lot of services together in schools to support students e.g. youth workers, counsellors, nurses etc.

This survey is for young people aged 12-17, currently in year 7 to 13 at school. It asks questions about where you go for help and about student services you have available at your school.

Are you that someone?

Today, a new campaign was launched by Social Development Minister Paula Bennett, aimed at helping young New Zealanders stop sexual violence.

The campaign encourages young people to identify the signs that someone may be at risk of sexual violence, and find ways to safely step in early. It will use social media to share advice and information and encourage people to think and talk about preventing sexual violence.

"That means for example recognising when someone's too wasted to give consent to sex, and speaking up on their behalf. It means checking in with your mates to see if they're OK with the attention they're getting," says Minister Bennett.

The Department of Internal Affairs, Akina Foundation and Contact Energy have recently launched a new accelerator Programme "the Launchpad", which has been designed to take inspired business ideas and turn them into tested, investment-ready social enterprises that will have a big impact on a social or environmental problem.

With six months of intensive support and coaching, their aim is to turn 10 inspired social enterprise ideas into thriving, self-sustaining businesses.

The programme will run from October 2014 to March 2015. It will provide participants with high-quality business mentoring and coaching: theory, tools, access to networks, markets and investment; and a window into the reality of what makes a successful social entrepreneur.
