Accommodation



College House - Wairarapa

Wairarapa College Hostel is conveniently located at 55 Renall Street and close to central Masterton. The college house grounds are surrounded by mature native trees and landscaped gardens. It is quiet, peaceful and picturesque. Hostel also includes recreational facilities such as; Games Room, Television and Common Room.

The options for this accommodation are:

5 bed unit (including shower and toilet) - Max 5 people per unit (6 units), ideal for small groups 3 - 5 people.

Family Flat (self contained) $1\ x$ double room $2\ x$ twin single - Ideal for a small group travelling together.

Dormitory type accommodation - ideal for the larger groups. We have boys and girls accommodation so can split by gender as needed.

This accommodation is \$30pp per night and includes breakfast.

The Conference Venue:

Masterton Town Hall, housed in the Municipal Building is located at 22 Perry Street, Masterton. the Masterton Town Hall is a spacious venue used for dances, conferences, displays, weddings and stage shows. The entire conference and evening dinner will be based at this venue.

Speakers

Billy Graham



A world class international speaker, Billy Graham is New Zealand's best-loved motivator and fitness advisor. Bold, humorous and brimming over with energy and enthusiasm, Billy is passionate about inspiring people to increase their potential. He stresses the importance of combining a healthy body with a healthy attitude and of making the most of very opportunity, talking to a wide cross-section of the community from the business executive to NZ Police, through to school children. Billy delights in telling stories of his own to show that anyone can make it. Having left school unable to read or write, Billy took up butchering, later teaching at three New Zealand colleges, and developing his own business as an international motivational speaker and fitness advisor. He has spoken at some of the most prestigious guest platforms in the world, having delivered

keynote presentations in the UK, USA, Singapore, Malaysia and Australia. He has appeared numerous times on national television, in local and national newspapers and radio. No small achievement for a dyslexic who left school at 14! Having spent a lifetime involved in sport and physical fitness, Billy has designed a unique fitness product complete with endorsements from the US Air Force Academy and Floyd Patterson; ex-world heavy weight champion. A former New Zealand and Australasian light welterweight boxing champion, Billy has achieved success through goal setting and determination. In January 2006 Billy established the Naenae Boxing Academy; a charitable work which is the fulfilment of a life-long dream to have his own boy's club in his troubled home town of Naenae. Billy trains up to 80 young men three days a week; a large number of whom are at serious risk, out of his desire to make a difference and provide for others what was provided for him. In 2011 Billy received the national title of New Zealander of the Year Local Hero for outstanding service to the nation. Published in 2012 Billy's second book 'Making Champion Men', based on his experiences mentoring Kiwi youth, was chosen for presentation to international publishers at the 2013 Frankfurt International Book Fair. Billy is having a significant impact on a supportive community. He loves people! His warm and enthusiastic presentation captivates business executives and children alike.

Jason Pemberton



Jason was involved with Christchurch's Student Volunteer Army from the beginning, eventually co-founding The Concert and the Volunteer Army Foundation to continue the initial momentum. After two years of leading these organisations Jason now fills his time in governance roles, contracting to Volunteer Army Foundation and speaking, singing and playing guitars.

The Concert: In 2012 the Volunteer Army Foundation created an initiative designed to lure youth into experiencing volunteer activity, based on RockCorps. On Saturday the 3rd or November, 2012, hosted a 10 hour music event at the New AMI Stadium in Addington, Christchurch. The catch? The only way to get a ticket was to volunteer at least four hours of time on any one of over 900 volunteer projects and events advertised through the custom built website. The functionality of this website now still exists in the 'Get Involved' section of the volunteer army foundation.

Artem Axenov



Artem Axenov is a 20 year old student at Victoria University of Wellington in his final year of a Bachelor of Commerce degree majoring in Management and Economics.

In 2011 Artem became involved with Rotaract, a youth club sponsored by Rotary. After being a President of the Wellington club, he became the Rotaract representative for the lower north island and is now focusing on growing Rotaract and engagement with the community. Artem has been trained in NZ and overseas on leadership and communication through his time with Rotaract and has honed many of these skills during his work. His studies of management supplement the training received to achieve the best outcomes. Passing on knowledge has been an important part of Artems role as Rotaract district representative and he has excelled at building teams and empowering young people when working on projects.

In his spare time Artem enjoys music, photography, his cat, travelling and most recently playing the piano.

Kieran McAnulty



Kieran McAnulty is the Labour Candidate for Wairarapa. His family have lived in the Wairarapa for five generations. He was schooled in Carterton and Masterton, and went to university at Massey and Otago. After a stint playing rugby in Ireland, Kieran has returned home to Wairarapa with his Irish wife, a BA in Politics, an MA in Political Positioning and Communications and a Diploma in Business Administration. Ana Coffey was elected to Porirua City Council in 2010 and is currently the Deputy Mayor of a city where almost 40% of the population are under the age of 25. She has worked with young people for almost 20 years. Previously she has been a primary school teacher and youth leader. 'Ana continues to engage with Porirua through her work as a dance teacher and also as a mum of four young children. She sees her role at the council as a way to advocate for young people and encourage participation in local decision making.

Michelle White



My name is Michelle White and I have worked at the Minister of Youth Development (MYD) since October 2012. I am currently in the role of National Youth Participation Advisor, but previously I was the Event Coordinator for Youth Parliament 2013.

Held in July 2013, Youth Parliament involved 141 young people coming to Parliament for two days. Prior to the event, Youth Members of Parliament engaged with their communities to bring their views to Parliament. During the two day event they sat on Select Committees, engaged in debate and asked questions of Cabinet Ministers. I am passionate about young people being supported to be actively involved in their communities and one of the best things about working at MYD is hearing and seeing the amazing things young people do to contribute to our society.

Hey I'm Cam my passion is entertaining people, I thrive on inspiring people to believe in themselves. After completing high school I Studied Radio at The New Zealand Broadcasting School. Since then I have completed an internship with ZM and am now working for iHeart Radio where I launch Ultimate Access. I have a really weird taste in music. Liam McEwan



Liam is a radio host on Ultimate Access on iHeartRadio, which broadcasts from Auckland, New Zealand. He along with Cam Mansel hosts a weekly three hour daily show, with a focus on music, entertainment, and interviews.

Liam began his radio career by presenting a Sunday morning show on Devonport community radio station, The Flea FM since early 2009 at the age of 13, and watch his show grow to gain an international listener base, with listener numbers ranging from 60,000 - 65,000 each week, either listening live, or via podcast. This makes it the most listened to show on a community station worldwide.

In 2013, the New Zealand Herald dubbed Liam New Zealand's third most influential Tweeter. Listener participation plays a big part during Ultimate Access. Both Liam and Cam use Twitter account as a way to keep in touch with listeners, and to take listener requests.
